






READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!

SHARE & CARE! Growing in Goodness & Love: This Wednesday's Word...

"Baptism is God's most beautiful and magnificent gift." St Gregory of Nazianzus

Ask your child what they know about baptism. Ask them if they know what any of the symbols of baptism represent (e.g. candle, water, oil, white garment, the sign of the cross). If your child has been baptised, ask them if they know who chose their name, and why that name was chosen for them. You might also like to share with your child any memories you have of their baptism and how you chose their name. Perhaps you have photographs to show them.

Baptism is the start of a life-long call to reveal God's Spirit to our family and community. When we are baptised, we receive the very same Holy Spirit, to help us to live like Jesus. How can we live more like Jesus as

Perhaps we can: always try to be fair, honest, generous and ready to go out of our way to help others; as a family, choose to support a charity in 2019; regularly make an effort to let other family members know how much we love them.
